## **Course Prerequisites**

There are no prerequisites for this course.

### **Course Description**

Introduces and explores the philosophical and practical issues related to ethical decision making. Emphasizes the analysis of ethical problems and the development of analytical skills and values. Incorporates case studies, journal articles, current events, and debates as practical examples of ethical issues.

#### **Student Learning Outcomes**

The chief objectives of this course are to enable students to:

- Describe the various ethical models for decision making in the public sector setting.
- Describe the differences between personal and public ethics.
- Identify, define, apply and evaluate codes of ethics for their applicability and effectiveness within the public sector.
- Analyze ethical concepts in cultivating integrity, professionalism, diversity and social responsibility for the individual and within an organizational climate.
- Analyze ethical case studies using the rational analysis model.

### **Course Methodology Online Instruction**

This is a Web-based course which will employ several types of learning tools and new technologies.
